ABSTRACT

Rahmat Tri Aditya, *Chinese Ethnic Attitudes Toward the Leadership of Jakarta Governor Basuki Tjahaja Purnama* (The research was conducted in Perhimpunan Indonesia Tionghoa (INTI) which is located area of Mega Glodok Kemayoran, Central Jakarta), Thesis, Jakarta: Study Program Pancasila and Citizenship Education, Faculty of Science social, State University of Jakarta.

This research is motivated by the election of Tjahaja Basuki Purnama (Ahok) as Jakarta governor for the first of the ethnic Chinese. Ethnic Chinese themselves constitute ethnic minorities in Jakarta, but there is apparently a Chinese figures are Lieus Sungkharisma who refused Basuki Purnama Tjahaja because it is considered to be defamatory ethnic Chinese. As an ethnic minority, should support Basuki Purnama Tjahaja consistent with the theory that primordial tendency to support the same ethnicity.

This study used qualitative research methods. This study aims to determine how the actual attitude towards the ethnic Chinese leadership Jakarta Governor Basuki Tjahaja Purnama. This study was conducted in March-May 2016. The tools used are observation, interviews, and documentation is done to the informant and key informants. Informants in this study is a member of the Chinese Indonesian Association (INTI), while Key informants in this study is twofold Head of the Secretariat CORE Center and Chairman of the Chinese Indonesian women. Then complemented by expert opinions Prof. Dr. Hamdi Muluk, M.Sc.

The results of this study indicate that ethnic Chinese have a good knowledge but common to the leadership of Governor of Jakarta. Then ethnic Chinese have a high assessment to the Governor of Jakarta, this is indicated by their ratings were good on all performance Basuki Tjahaja Purnama. And attitudes of ethnic Chinese who support Jakarta Governor Basuki Tjahaja Purnama in Election 2017 as well as strong support form one of them by collecting the ID card to Basuki Purnama Tjahaja forward independently.
