#### SARCASTIC UTTERANCES IN FASHION POLICE SHOW

The signs of sarcastic utterances are captures by Camp's theory. The writer will also highlight the prosodic cues or intonational countour in terms of the emphasized tone of voice that can be identified by its heavy stress, and slow rate (Haiman and Rockwell in Camp; 2011, p.3) including the expression of laughter that will be noted in brackets in order to locate sarcasm humour in context.

These are the cues to signifies the location of sarcasm:

Bold: Heavy stress

Italic: Slow rate

Yellow highlight: to locate sarcasm

The writer will analyse the sarcastic utterances in the Fashion Police show season 15, episode 03, "the 2016 Grammy Awards" which will be describe per segment.

#### THE 1<sup>st</sup> SEGMENT OF FASHION POLICE SHOW

The first segment talks about *must-see looks* from the Grammy Award. The first one to be commented was the singer Taylor Swift, who is wearing Italier Versace. Brad, Melissa and Margaret stated that they didn't like Taylor's outfit. In the other side, Guiliana loves Taylor swift outfit because its just classic Taylor style. Nene's opinion was about Taylor's hair, body, and thought that her overall look was just an okay look or standard.

The next *must-see look* from the *Grammy Award* is Selena Gomez. Melissa opens it by stating Selena's outfit, which is the "blue beaded gown by Calvin Klein". Guiliana, Margaret, and Brad gave an opinion, which implicated that they love her dress. Nene's opinion was that the dress was just ok and doesn't give her anything special about it. Melissa didn't compliment about the dress instead she just say that Selena has a beautiful face and she is so talented.

The third *must-see look from the Grammy Award is* Beyonce. Melissa opens the topic by saying that it pains her, to see Beyonce in her outfit. Beyonce was wearing in a Dror bridal gown. Nene said that Beyonce is the queen and gives fully support to Beyonce. Other co-host like Guiliana, Brad and Margaret dislikes the dress.

Guiliana also thinks that Lady Gaga really delivers her outfit. Nene's opinion was contradicts from the other co-hosts, she doesn't like Gaga's outfit and said it to be scary. Margaret agrees with Nene that Gaga really does look scary.

### THE 2<sup>nd</sup> SEGMENT OF FASHION POLICE SHOW

The second segment of the fashion police show is the segment of *a double-take*. In this session, they think that the various looks from the Grammy Awards are in need of a one more glance to really appreciate. Therefore they want to take a double take or double look at the Grammy's red-carpet fashion.

The first one is Ciara with Alexander Gaultier's dress that was commented by each of the co-host. Guiliana, Brad, and Melissa loves her outfit but some of them like Nene and Margaret don't. Nene thought that she wore the same kind of outfit that Tony Braxton did years ago in the Grammys.

The next one is the singer Demi Lovato in black jacket and skirt by Nurisol Ferrari. The comments from Guiliana concludes that she really likes Demi's style and in the other side, Margaret comments about Demi's outfit is like want to flirt with her husband's boss. Melissa also loves Bella Hadid and Brad was envy to Bella Hadid because she was so young and can be this successful. Margaret says that they are the cute couple and Bella Hadid was so perfect. In the end of the session, Melissa says that in the next segment there will be a guest star, her name is Tinashe who is a pop princess who graces the pages of Playboy.

#### THE 3<sup>rd</sup> SEGMENT OF FASHION POLICE SHOW

The opening of the segment, Melissa introduces Tinashe as the guest star. They talk about her latest photo shoot for *Playboy* magazine, her newest album and tour, and her opinions about Katy Perry and Niki Minaj. This segment is the *social media slammer*. Melissa said that "sometimes the Joan rangers (fashion police's fans) are quick to convict celebrity's styles choices even before the fashion police have spoken.". Therefore, Melissa will read a tweet in social media about certain celebrities fashion and each in everyone will decide if the star should stay in the slammer or if they should be released.

The first star is Asap Rocky, the Joan Rangers tweeted about him, and all of them agreed to release Asap Rocky because they think this is fashion except Tinashe who thinks that he should stay in the slammer. The next star is Tove Lo, and everybody was agreed to make Tove Lo stay in the slammer except for Tinashe.
